

CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

What does Sephardic history have to do with New Mexico? Quite a bit, as it turns out. At this conference speakers will explore the riches of Jewish Spain before 1492, its history, music, art, and philosophy, and talk about several prominent Jewish families.

After the expulsion over one hundred thousand Jews left Spain for Italy, Turkey, and North Africa. Some eventually made the trek north along the Rio Grande into New Mexico and southern Colorado, which is the focus of the second part of the program.
