ACCOMMODATIONS

grams and activities will be headquartered in one place to make it convenient and comfortable. By guaranteeing a specified number of room reservations, we have been able to negotiate very favorable room rates and services. Look at these rates: *Single - \$39/night.*

Double - \$49/ night. Triple - \$59/ night. Rooms are either on the ground floor or served by elevator. Non-smoking and handicapped accessible rooms are available. And, your room rate includes a **complimentary buffet breakfast** in the Hotel dining room.

A large Hospitality Suite, located next to the Meeting Rooms, will also be available to speakers, members and guests.

Want more for your money? Each room reservation entitles you to free access to the heated indoor swimming pool and health club, which includes sauna, hot tub, and exercise equipment. For a nominal fee, you can even schedule a personal massage from the Hotel's licensed staff.

RESERVATIONS

The key to Conference logistics, is hotel room reservations. The more rooms we reserve, the more services we can negotiate with the Hotel. Early registration will help us enormously, and to help accomplish this goal, we are again offering a **discount on all registrations received no later than 15 October.** You

will receive Registration forms together with the formal Conference Brochure, by the middle of September.

REGISTRATION INCLUDES all program sessions and all planned meals. Membership may be applied for at time of Registration. Certain part time Registration fees will also be available to accommodate specific schedules. They may be requested after 1 November, by calling our Voice Mail: 505/989-6656. Fire regulations limit seating space, and priority will be given to those attending the entire weekend. To keep registration fees low, the Society Board has voted to finance certain expenses out of our treasury. With lower room rates and lower transportation expenses, your total cost for this Conference will be less than previous Conferences, even though the Society's expenses are greater. Please plan on spending this weekend with us.

HOTEL RESERVATION FORMS will be included with the Conference Brochure which will be mailed later in September. Or you can call the Hotel now at 1-800/462-0936. All room rates are plus tax, and guaranteed through 31 October 1997. *When making hotel reservations please also specify your choice of entree for the banquet, and preference for Saturday tour. (see Saturday Activities)*

TRANSPORTATION

Getting there will be a lot of fun on the special bus Lee Leven has hired to serve you. Leaving on Friday

from Albuquerque, with a stop in Santa Fe, the bus will take you in comfort and without hassle to the Hotel. On Sunday afternoon, it will whisk you home after the Brunch. *Reservations for this bus trip must be made separately*, and will be on a first come-first served basis. The bus holds 47 people. From Albuquerque the fare is \$35 round trip; from Santa Fe, \$20 round trip. If you are thinking of commuting from Santa Fe, please think again. Why miss any of the sessions or drive at night in possibly inclement weather. Enjoy the company of friends - *ess, shmooze or snooze on the "leave it to us" joy ride to Los Alamos. MEALS

✓ HISTORICAL BUS TOUR

We have hired a professional tour guide to conduct a two-hour historic tour of Los Alamos. Forty-six people can go on this bus. There is no additional charge, but it is by RESERVATION ONLY. Seating will be assigned based on earliest postmarks on written reservations. Help us avoid last years' crunch. Also, please give consideration to those whose health requires riding.

✓ HISTORICAL WALKING TOURS

Docents from the Los Alamos Historic Society have been retained to give walking tours of the Museum and environs. Each 8-10 people will be assigned a guide. This will take approximately one hour. Detailed maps will be available for those who prefer to do this walking tour on their own.

✓ **BRADBURY SCIENCE MUSEUM**
This wonderful "hands on" science Museum will be open for your pleasure. A special guide will be available to answer your questions. There is no charge.

✓ **ADDITIONAL IDEAS**
On your own you may like to explore nearby facilities at Bandelier National Monument,

San Ildefonso Pueblo, or the Pajarito Mountain Ski area; Or attend a local crafts fair at the Los Alamos Middle School. Or gamble at a nearby Indian casino.

✓ **LAZY. HAZY AFTERNOON**
The Hotel indoor heated swimming pool and Spa will be open to serve you. Other than the Historic Bus Tour, you may combine

any/all of these other activities into an afternoon schedule that meets your pleasure quotient.

AT MONTEFIORE CEMETERY IN LAS VEGAS ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, AT 10 A.M.

The New Mexico Jewish Historical Society and the Las Vegas Cemetery Committee will hold the Annual Cemetery Cleanup at Montefiore Cemetery in Las Vegas on Sunday, September 28, at 10 a.m.

As in previous years, a lunch will be provided by the Las Vegas Cemetery Association.

Before the task of cleaning up begins, there will a brief talk by Marvin Taichert, a local resident and descendent of one of the early Jewish merchants of Las Vegas. Annual Archives Reception

IN SANTA FE ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 22

Mark your calendar for the Annual Archives Reception on Wednesday, October 22, 1997, from 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. We will be holding this year's reception at the State Records Center and Archives building at 404 Montezuma for the last time. Some time early in 1998, the NMJHS Archive, will move, along with the entire state collection, over to the new building on Cerrillos Road and Camino Carlos Rey. The new facility will provide much better storage and preservation for all archival materials.

Thanks to a new agreement, we will continue our relationship with the State Records Center & Archives for at least the next five years. That is, our collection will be housed with the state records, but will remain the property of the NMJHS. This new agreement will guarantee that the NMJHS collection is covered by the same insurance and safekeeping provisions as all other state records. We are free to renegotiate this agreement at any time.

Our Annual Archives Reception will feature historic materials from the Rubins in Raton, N.M., the retail clothing store founded by Barney Rubin in 1916. We anticipate Leon and Kathryn Rubin will be on hand to talk about the history of the store and their family's four-generation history of life in north-east New Mexico. Kathryn serves as the "mayordoma" of Temple Aaron in Trinidad, Colorado.

We look forward to seeing you at the reception. Light refreshments will be served.
