Your name and was mentioned at the JewishGen-Site JGFF and that you are searching for the town of Lipsko.

Let me introduce myself. My name is mentioned in the letter-head. My father who passed away a long time ago, was born in Lipsko and survived the camps and was liberated in Vaihingen/Enz Germany.

My fathers name was Paltiel Lajtman, I guess that was the spelling before the war.

He had 8 brothers and 4 sister, all married with children, apparently all were killed during the war. As there is nobody left, I do not know their names.

I don't know where you are in your journey of your „roots“, I am just at the beginning and would be very grateful of any kind of hints about Lipsko.

The Mormons do have some records of Lipsko which I have not seen. Apparently it's rather complicated to get them in Europe.. If you are interested, please let me know.

The only thing I found up to now was a statistic mentioned in the Jiskor book of Radom, about the total jewish population during these years. (Source: IRGUN YOTZEY RADOM, Tel-Aviv, 1961)
